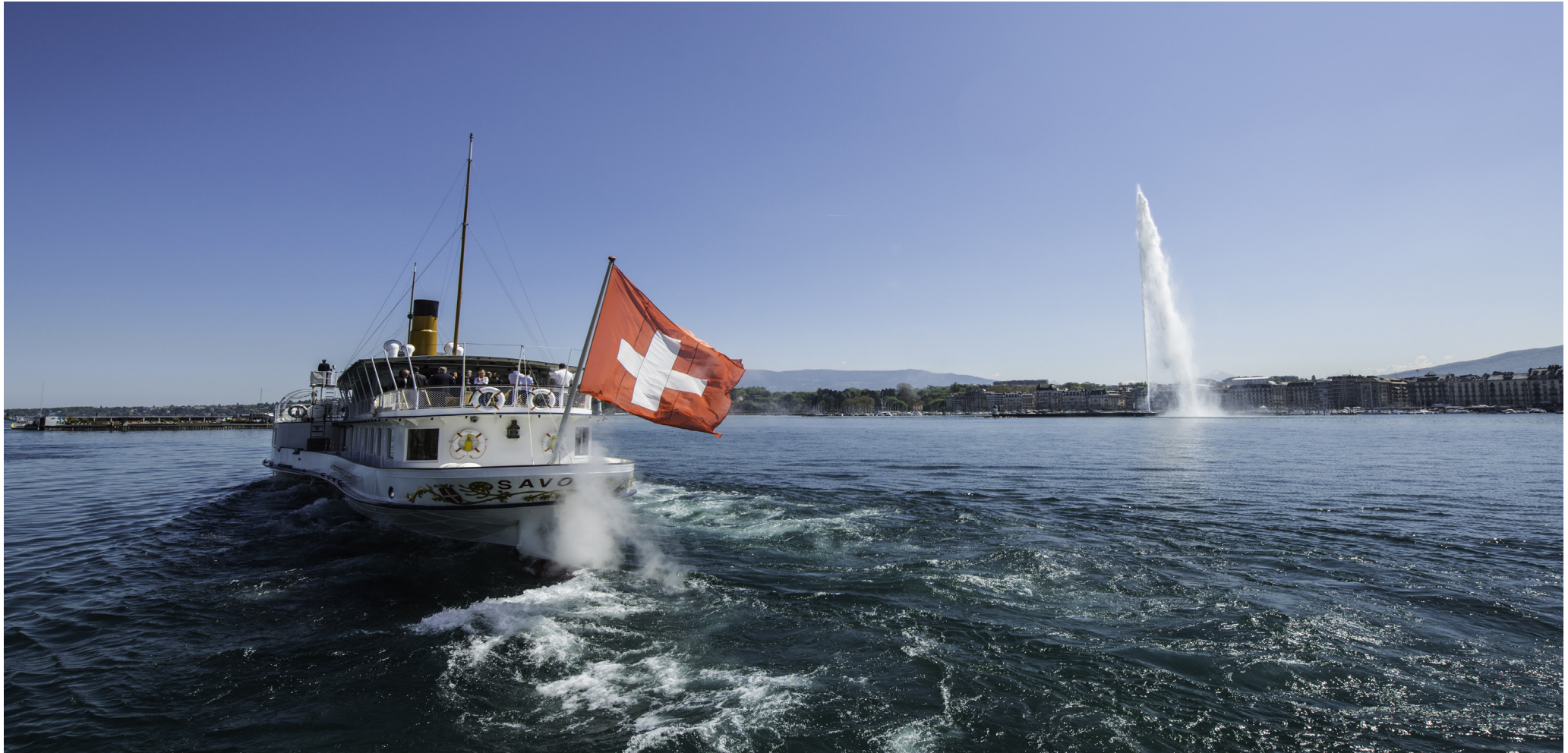

Dear Colleagues,

The LIDC Swiss Group, the LIDC and the IPI are delighted to welcome you again in Switzerland.

The last LIDC Swiss Congress took place in September 2002 in Montreux. For those who were not members at that time, Montreux was the place where the General Meeting of the LIDC decided to modify the format of the congresses that were at the time organized over two subsequent years in two different locations. In that sense, the Swiss Group organized in 2002 a Congress that was only dedicated to the international reports (there were 4 questions then).

It is also interesting to note that the first question was related to competition law and sport whereas the fourth question was related to domain names registration.

Description: International competition can be understood in many ways. At the institutional level, it starts with competition between the multilateral WTO framework and bilateral agreements; but are competition issues sufficiently taken into consideration in international trade?  
Are they at all included in the WTO Agreements?  
What about bilateral agreements?  
If yes how, and if not, how could or should they be?  
And how do IP provisions in the TRIPS Agreement and in bilateral agreements coexist?  
Finally, competition also exists in dispute resolution services. The Panel will concentrate on the unique dispute settlement procedure of the WTO and on the role of industry in WTO panels.
